ometimes it seems as if life is a laboratory of designed experiments on how to become human, all of them allotted ten-year blocks.

Have you noticed how nine- and ten-year-olds can be easy to be around? Then about the time we've gotten being a kid down to a science, life begins to move us into adolescence. We want to be independent and responsible, but we don't yet have all the skills. We have sexual feelings, but we're expected not to act on them. About the time we reach adulthood and move into our twenties, it seems we can finally do what we want, but then we might drink too much, spend too much, drive too fast, and party too long. Once we begin to settle down around year thirty, we have to learn how to live with another person. One likes it warm, the other cool. One seeks to save, the other spends. One is a homebody, the other enjoys going out on the town. By the time we've gotten to our sixties and seventies, we may have figured out life, but by then we've used up most of our energy.

What's going on?

Faith suggests it's the hand of God shaping us into the sort of persons we're meant to be. "Lord, you are our father; we are the clay and you our potter: we are all the work of your hand" (Isaiah 64:7). Advent may be a time to figure out how God is acting in your life now and look back to see that God was shaping you all along.

ADVENT, from the Latin *ad-venio*, meaning "to come to", is a season of repentance covering the four weeks before Christmas in preparation for the birth of the Christ Child. Advent begins the Sunday nearest the Feast of St. Andrew on Nov. 30 and is the beginning of the new ecclesiastical year in Western churches. During this period the priest wears purple except for the third Sunday, "Gaudete" Sunday.

We are counselled to prepare ourselves worthily to celebrate the anniversary of the Lord's coming into the world as the incarnate God of Love, thus making our souls fitting homes for the Redeemer coming in Holy Communion and in Grace. It also serves to prepare us for His final coming as Judge at death and at the end of the world.

On the third Sunday the priest's vestments change to a pink or rose color. Our Advent theme turns this day from Preparation and Hope to a more joyous atmosphere of Anticipation and Expectancy knowing the Christmas celebration is very near.

During these four weeks we will see the Advent wreath with four candles—3 purple and 1 pink representing the four weeks in Advent, and often a white candle in the middle, the *Christ Candle*, lit on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day.

You will hear the "O" Antiphons, a summary of Salvation History, revealed through the Old Testament and fulfilled with the Redemption. They beg God with mounting impatience to come and save His people: they "paint in vivid terms the wretched condition of mankind and his need of a Savior." Interestingly, the messianic titles for Jesus, beginning with Emmanuel, spell the Latin words ERO CRAS which means, "Tomorrow, I will come."

Some long-standing cultural traditions offer a Christmas Novena for the nine days preceding Christmas as we will do here at Holy Cross this year.

What is a Novena?

Succinctly, a novena is a nine-day period of private or public prayer to obtain special graces, to implore special favors, or make special petitions. (Novena is derived from the Latin novem, meaning nine.) As the definition suggests, the novena has always had more of a sense of urgency and neediness.

The origin of the novena in our Church's spiritual treasury is hard to pinpoint. The Old Testament does not indicate any nine-day celebration among the Jewish people. On the other hand, in the New Testament at the Ascension our Lord gives the Apostles the Great Commission and then tells them to return to Jerusalem and to await the coming of the Holy Spirit. The Acts of the Apostles recounts. Nine days later, the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles at Pentecost. Perhaps this "nine-day period of prayer" of the Apostles is the basis for the novena.


