ur lives are filled with calls of one kind or another. Phone calls, text messages, teachers who call on us in class, those who call us for supper, people behind a counter who call out, "Next!" And, sooner or later, death will call each of us.

Jonah was once called to go to Nineveh, and the people of Nineveh were called to repent and change their lives. Simon and Andrew, John and James were called to follow Jesus. And today God calls each of us, but it is never easy to sort out what it is we are called to do.

Saint Paul took pains to tell us that "the world in its present form is passing away" (1 Corinthians 7:31). That being true, then God's call is always into a new way of life, which seems to imply leaving something behind, not unlike the four followers in Sunday's Gospel leaving their fishing nets and their father Zebedee in his boat.

The world that is passing away may be childhood, or productivity as we age. The new world may require confronting addiction and leaving a life of what we thought we couldn't live without. Or, like the people of Nineveh who were called to repent, it might be a call for our nation to confront our failure to engage in dialogue about and find solutions to injustice in its many forms at home and abroad. Who knows what God's new world will be? •

CATECHISM LESSON THIRTY-EIGHT

What is Eucharist?

<u>Catechism Text</u>: CCC nos. 1355, 1373-1378, 1388 & 1413.

Sacred Scripture: Luke: 19-20, John: 15.5, 6.35-58,

Acts: 2.46 & 47, 1Cor: 10.16 & 17

St. Thomas Aquinas: The Eucharist is the sacrament of love; it signifies love, and it produces love. The Eucharist is the consummation of the whole spiritual life. **St. Euphrasia:** To speak of the Blessed Sacrament is to speak of what is most sacred.

FAQ: How is the Catechism "adapted" to the multi-cultural situation of the Church (Canada or otherwise)?

It is an ongoing task for bishops, authors, editors, and publishers of catechetical materials who revise and develop] in light of serious consideration of the *Catechism*'s entire content and its general directive for "indispensable adaptation". Together, they communicate the Church's universal teaching as expressed in the Church's experience. That experience is multicultural and indigenous, especially in North America; therefore, any catechetical materials developed must align with particular cultural experiences while true to the entire content of the *Catechism*.



<u>Gestures</u> – our Catholic faith is rich with them. They express the mysterious realities of our faith in a tangible way that even the littlest of us can recognize, perform, and understand. Recalling the Magi's homage to Jesus, we introduce the gesture of genuflection to the children. Just as the wise men from the East fell to their knees before the infant, so too do the children learn to genuflect to Jesus. We go small because He is great. Yes, how great a king this is who had the stars of the cosmos proclaiming His new presence on earth! We are saddened to announce the passing of Fr. Cornelius Lucey over the weekend in Torquay at the age of 102.

Fr. Lucey was born in Ireland in 1921 and emigrated to Canada, arriving in Saskatchewan in October 1946. He was

ordained to the priesthood in Regina by Archbishop O'Neill in 1955. He served in many of the small towns in southern Saskatchewan and was a judge on the Diocesan Matrimonial Tribunal for many years, receiving an Award of Merit for his long service there.

He spent 21 years at Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Torquay where he retired. He was known as a humble and generous man living his priesthood in poverty and obedience.

May Fr. Lucey rest in the peace of Christ and may the Holy Spirit grant comfort to his family and friends, the people he served, and his brother priests.

Please remember him in your prayers, and may flights of angels take Fr. Lucey to his place of rest.

The **De Margerie Lectures on Christian Reconciliation and Unity** with the Rev. Dr. Karen Petersen Finch.

The quest for Christian unity has traditionally been initiated at the international level between official leaders of Christian denominations, with the effects of their dialogue expected to trickle down to local Christian communities.

In Grassroots Ecumenism, Karen Petersen Finch upends this process, proposing an approach to Christian unity that begins in your neighbourhood. She draws directly from her experience equipping everyday Christians to know their own Christian tradition more thoroughly and to engage thoughtfully with separated Christians down the street and around the corner.
