very family has stories of times past when

unique and curious happenings gave color to family life. They are part of each family's lore, told again and again with as much gusto as when they were told for the first time. Though everyone has heard them countless times, telling these stories still reminds us of who we are as family, lest we forget. This is why the faith community, the family of the Church, tells stories from the Bible every time we gather. We've heard them before many times, but we tell them because they are part of our history, part of who we have been, and part of who we are as God's people, lest we forget.

The stories in sacred Scripture are not just stories of past lives; they are also stories of our own lives. The story of Moses standing before the burning bush in awe of God's presence is also our story as we come upon nature's beauty or experience the birth of a child. The story of Joseph, the son of Jacob sold into slavery by his brothers, may also be our story of being betrayed by someone we love. Zacchaeus climbing a tree to see Jesus is our story of longing to see and know God in our lives and in our homes. The story of the good shepherd is the story of God seeking us out, forgiving us, and carrying us back to life.We recognize the stories of sacred Scripture as our stories.

PRO-LIFE NEWS

Two of our parishioners went to last Sunday's talk by Dr. David Kopriva at Our Lady Peace on end-of-life questions and our Catholic Faith, the sacredness of human life, the use of MAiD vs palliative care in an effort to end suffering. They provide a short report here:

It was explained that the intent of MAiD is murder, the killing of an innocent person whether by direct intervention or by providing the means. The intent of palliative care is to make the patient comfortable and pain free. If that should mean the shortening of life due to the medications required, it is not the intent. And that's the difference for Catholics, the intent,

There are now MAiD teams operating in hospitals ready to be called upon. We know that taking our own lives in not the answer. We should also know that we do not have to accept treatment which is more burdensome to us than the illness we may have. It is to our benefit to speak to our political representatives about supporting more palliative care, and just as importantly, to press for conscience rights for our medical personnel.

From the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops: "Our position remains unequivocal. Euthanasia and assisted suicide constitute the deliberate killing of human life in violation of God's commandments; they erode our shared dignity by failing to see, to accept, and accompany those suffering and dying. Furthermore, they undermine the fundamental duty we have to take care of the weakest and most vulnerable members of society. Human life must be protected from conception to natural death, at all stages and in all conditions."

The Regina Pro Life Association is calling on all parishioners to participate in the Green Ribbon Sunday Campaign, which remembers the Morgentaler decision of January 28, 1988, when the Supreme Court of Canada struck down all laws regarding abortion. Since then, there have been more than 4 million abortions in Canada.

Please take a green ribbon and bookmark which are available at the church entrances. We encourage you to wear them until the 28th of January, but you can certainly wear them longer. The bookmarks include a prayer for the end to abortion that we kindly ask you to pray daily.


A 7-Episode video series with Father John Weckend


