
s the story is told, two men were talking about why they go or do not go to church every weekend. One argued why he no longer comes to Mass: "I went every Sunday for almost thirty years and I can't remember a single sermon from all those years that I sat in a pew." The other thought about that and then replied, "You know, my wife and I have been married for more than twenty-five years. Just about every day during those years my wife and I sat down and shared a meal at least twice a day. Now I can't say that I remember more than one or two of those meals, but if we hadn't sat down to share those meals every day, I don't think we would still be married today."

Surely there are many reasons why Catholics come

to the Eucharist each weekend. Some come for the homily, some for receiving holy Communion, others for the singing, and still others to be part of a faith community. For most, it is probably some of each. Yet behind all of it, though most might not think of saying so, is a commitment to be people of faith, to believe in the Lord Jesus, and to live as his disciples. It is the same commitment the Hebrews made in the desert in Exodus 24:3: "We will do everything that the LORD has told us." Indeed, how long would we be believers and disciples of Jesus without being fed at his table?

Bishop Mark Hagemoen heard of this. He spoke with Paul and arranged for his ordination to be expedited. Paul was ordained to the permanent diaconate Sunday, May 27 at St Paul's Hospital chapel.

Tuesday, May 28 over the noon hour Paul passed away from a cancer discovered only three months ago. He had lived his deaconate ministry for 41 hours.

Please keep Paul in your prayers. Keep his wife Ely and their children in your prayers as well. His Saskatoon diaconate candidate brother Nicolas Blom will be ordained June 28.



#### **PRO-LIFE NEWS**

The Regina Pro Life Association held its annual banquet and fundraiser on Thursday, May 23<sup>rd</sup> at St. Martin de Porres parish hall, with close to 200 people in attendance, eight of whom were Holy Cross parishioners. Cam Cote, Western Outreach Director at the Canadian Centre for Bioethical Reform (CCBR), was an excellent guest speaker. In his inspiring talk, he spoke their vision for Canada to be an abortion-free nation and how they are working toward their vision, one person at a time.

He talked about the wonderful rates of success they have in changing people's minds with 27% of abortion supporters become fully pro-life through a single conversation, and around 24% more becoming significantly more pro-life, based on just over 8,100 conversations their team has tracked over the last two years.

A number of CCBR staff and interns will be in Regina from June 7 – 14 for workshops and one-on-one training for anyone who is interested in learning how to be able to dialogue about abortion in a meaningful way. Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a Montessori based faith formation program for children. This summer, July 2-7 this national formation course will be offered here in Regina.

In Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, adults are given the opportunity to embrace a method of catechesis (or religious education) that will deepen one's relationship with God. Catechist formation in Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is both instructive as well as experiential. It captivates both the head as well as the heart. It has a holistic approach for the adult, enriching the adult in a background of scripture and liturgy, theology and prayer, as well as the pedagogy of the young child, helping the adult to see what face of God the young child most needs in order to enter into a relationship with God.

Therefore, Catechesis of the Good Shepherd requires the adult to receive training in the method in a way that is "retreat-like", giving time and space to absorb the richness of what it means to live one's baptismal covenant and grow in the love and knowledge of God.
