Spirited Life

We are in a time when many seem to live with deep anger, much of which may come from fear generated by a sense of loss of control over our lives. We struggle to control the economy, our borders, the spread of disease, the violence in our cities and on our roads. Places once deemed safe—our schools, stores, and churches—have been invaded by violence. Ironically, those who feel most threatened by violence tend to turn to violence as a solution.

Do the scripture readings on this feast of Pentecost offer any hint of light as to how we might move forward?

Saint Paul's Letter to the Romans contrasts living in the flesh with living in the spirit that has been given to us. To "live in the flesh" is Paul's code word for living by our baser instincts—lust for power, revenge, and pleasure; anger; greed—all of which focus on ourselves. By contrast, to live in the spirit is to respond not from our baser instincts but rather to choose a more noble path, to take the high road, to care for the common good. For Paul, living in the flesh is a dead end, unable to bring us to life now or in the hereafter. To live in the spirit is to live in God, already in this life. Thus, Paul cautions that we not "fall back into fear," something that arises from our preoccupation with the flesh. ●

PRO-LIFE NEWS

The MAiD amendment to the Criminal Code which permits a physician to kill a patient by lethal injection rather than providing medical treatment, came into effect in 2016. Montreal physician, Dr. Romona Coelha, has stated, "It's quicker to get MAiD than specialist care. A MAiD team will pay house calls within 24 hours, while doctors' house calls are extremely rare with many long waiting lists for treatment."

The amendment to the Criminal Code was portrayed to the Canadian public as resulting in a dignified, peaceful, serene death to end suffering. This was a deliberate lie used as propaganda to encourage the use of MAiD as a compassionate and acceptable solution to suffering. This lie has led to euthanasia becoming a commonly used treatment, not just for medical reasons, but also to replace social services required by the homeless, the poor, the disabled, the frail aged. It has become a cost/benefit advantage for the government.
