Living in Fantasy

If *Were a Horse* by Elizabeth Bridgman is a children's story about Jenny, who daydreams about being a horse and then accepts her true reality, as she realizes no one will recognize her as a horse. In the end, she finds that she likes herself as she truly is.

The story may also be a metaphor for our human fantasy about sin, by which we try to redefine the world on our own terms, only to realize that life does not go so well when we do this. It is our stealing by which we pretend that something belongs to us rather than to another. It is our lying that attempts to redefine truth in terms of what we want life to be, rather than in what life really is. It is our addictions that redefine the source of meaning and life not as God, but as ourselves and our wants. Lent brings us face to face with who we are—which is not a horse (real or otherwise), but, by God's design, is a daughter or son of God.

The temptations Jesus experienced in the desert were temptations to define life on his own terms, just as we are often tempted to do. Yet, Jesus was the one who got it right. For him, stones were stones, not bread. Power and glory were God's, not his. He would not put God to the test, thinking he could manipulate God and get God to do what Jesus wanted. Jesus was the faithful one. ●

While Hollywood may sometimes seem like the furthest thing from a place that nurtures the Catholic faith, the influence of Catholicism is undeniable in the American film industry and abroad. The controversial film "Conclave" was among the Best Picture nominees for this year's Academy Awards. Over the years there have been many other Hollywood blockbusters depicting Catholicism which have also made it to the Oscars.

The 1940's showed "The Song of Bernadette" (Bernadette Soubirous in Lourdes, France), Musicals "Going My Way" and its sequel "The Bells of St. Mary's" with Bing Crosby.

The 1950's had "The Robe" about the centurion who won Jesus' seamless garment at His crucifixion, "The Ten Commandments", and "Ben Hur". The 1960's saw "The Sound of Music", "The Agony and the Ecstasy", and "A Man for All Seasons" (Henry VIII and Sir Thomas More).

The 1970's: "The Exorcist"; the '80's with "The Mission". And in the 2000's: "The Passion of the Christ", "Silence", and "Killers of the Flower Moon".

That was fun thinking back about all those fantastic movies. But it does go to show you how much we Catholics represent our faith in our daily lives, and it's noticed.

PRO-LIFE NEWS

The Guardrails Restraining State-Assisted Death have flown off...

February marks the 10th anniversary of the Supreme Court of Canada's decision in Carter v. Canada (Attorney General) in which the court unanimously ruled, against both basic logic and its own precedents, that the right to life, guaranteed by the Constitution, included the right to a state assisted suicide through what came to be known as "Medical Assistance in Dying" (MAiD).

At the time, the court dismissed evidence from other jurisdictions that the legalization of euthanasia inevitably led to its open-ended expansion as well as abuse against the vulnerable. There would be no slippery slope, the court promised.

Ten years later, it is worth pondering how the Supreme Court's reassurances have aged. In 2016, Parliament legalized MAiD for people whose deaths were "reasonably foreseeable". A short five years later, during Covid, Canada's euthanasia regime was expanded to cover those with chronic conditions whose deaths were not imminent. At the same time, Parliament legalized euthanasia for mental illness alone to come into place in 2023; this has since been postponed to 2027, making a mockery of our society's commitment to mental health and suicide prevention.

Canada is now known as being the most progressive country in the world for MAiD. No longer a 'slippery slope', but a cliff of progressive death.

"I have now brought you the first fruits of the products of the soil which you, O Lord, have given to me." - Deuteronomy 26:10

Second, do you realize that everything you have and that everything you are has been given to you by God? We aren't owners of anything; we are merely stewards of God's gifts. Pray for a grateful and generous heart every day, in all circumstances.

GOVERNMENT of CANADA To Remove Charitable Status to Anti-Abortion Organizations and To Remove privileged status of the Advancement of Religion as a Charitable Purpose.

PLEASE SPEAK OUT... QUICKLY!

We have just received information that the Government of Canada will be considering two amendments given to them by the Standing Committee on Finance in their December report. They are to:

- 1) No longer provide charitable status to anti-abortion organizations, and to
- 2) Amend the Income Tax Act to provide a definition of a charity which would remove the privileged status of "advancement of religion" as a charitable purpose.

As you can see, this affects us very much as Catholics in that we believe in the sanctity of life and are therefore against abortion. And, of course, the amendment to the Income Tax Act to remove our charitable status would directly affect us as well.

This information has been late in coming and the **date to received input for the 2025 Budget is Monday, March 10**. We are asking you all to sign the petition stating that you **unreservedly disagree with these recommendations**. Copies are available at both entrances to the church. We will have the petitions scanned and sent to the Government Department of Finance early Monday.
