The controversial film "Conclave" was among the Best Picture nominees for this year's Academy Awards. Over the years there have been many other Hollywood blockbusters depicting Catholicism which have also made it to the Oscars.

The 1940's showed "The Song of Bernadette" (Bernadette Soubirous in Lourdes, France), Musicals "Going My Way" and its sequel "The Bells of St. Mary's" with Bing Crosby.

The 1950's had "The Robe" about the centurion who won Jesus' seamless garment at His crucifixion, "The Ten Commandments", and "Ben Hur". The 1960's saw "The Sound of Music", "The Agony and the Ecstasy", and "A Man for All Seasons" (Henry VIII and Sir Thomas More).

The 1970's: "The Exorcist"; the '80's with "The Mission". And in the 2000's: "The Passion of the Christ", "Silence", and "Killers of the Flower Moon".

#### **PRO-LIFE NEWS**

## The Guardrails Restraining State-Assisted Death have flown off....

February marks the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Supreme Court of Canada's decision in Carter v. Canada (Attorney General) in which the court unanimously ruled, against both basic logic and its own precedents, that the right to life, guaranteed by the Constitution, included the right to a state assisted suicide through what came to be known as "Medical Assistance in Dying" (MAiD).

At the time, the court dismissed evidence from other jurisdictions that the legalization of euthanasia inevitably led to its open-ended expansion as well as abuse against the vulnerable. There would be no slippery slope, the court promised.

Ten years later, it is worth pondering how the Supreme Court's reassurances have aged. In 2016, Parliament legalized MAiD for people whose deaths were "reasonably foreseeable". A short five years later, during Covid, Canada's euthanasia regime was expanded to cover those with chronic conditions whose deaths were not iminent. At the same time, Parliament legalized euthanasia for mental illness alone to come into place in 2023; this has since been postponed to 2027, making a mockery of our society's commitment to mental health and suicide prevention.

Canada is now known as being the most progressive country in the world for MAiD. No longer a 'slippery slope', but a cliff of progressive death.

#### <u>GOVERNEMNT fo CANADA To Remove</u> <u>Charitable Status to Anti-Abortion Organiza-</u> <u>tions and To Remove privileged status of the</u> <u>Advancement of Religion as a</u> <u>Charitable Purpose.</u>

#### PLEASE SPEAK OUT... QUICKLY!

We have just received information that the Government of Canada will be considering two amendments given to them by the Standing Committee on Finance in their December report. They are to:

- 1) No longer provide charitable status to anti-abortion organizations, and to
- Amend the Income Tax Act to provide a definition of a charity which would remove the privileged status of "advancement of religion" as a charitable purpose.

As you can see, this affects us very much as Catholics in that we believe in the sanctity of life and are therefore against abortion. And, of course, the amendment to the Income Tax Act to remove our charitable status would directly affect us as well.

This information has been late in coming and the *date to received input for the 2025 Budg-et is Monday, March 10.* We are asking you all to sign the petition stating that you <u>unreservedly</u> <u>disagree with these recommendations</u>. Copies are available at both entrances to the church. We will have the petitions scanned and sent to the Government Department of Finance early Monday.
