

wenty-five years ago, when Carl was about eighteen years old, he asked me how he would know when he had truly fallen in love. How would he know that it wasn't simply infatuation or passion and that she was the right person? Today, Carl tells me that I said something to him about recognizing that if you have to ask the question, it probably isn't love; it is probably the woman who best captures the most attractive aspects of all the women he has ever dated, liked, or loved.

For the next twenty years or so, Carl never seemed to find that love he was seeking—until one day, it happened. He fell in love and got married. Five years later, I asked Carl if it was indeed love. He said he believed it was, even though during those years of empty seeking, he thought true love would never come to him. He also said he's convinced that it was the hand of God that brought them together. Of that, he has no doubts.

In its own way, Carl's story is really the story of Peter and his friends going fishing and finding nothing all night long. Then, at dawn, a voice from the shore suggests that they try the other side of the boat. Lo and behold, an abundance appears where there had been only emptiness. That's when Peter and his friends realize, "It is the Lord!" For us, too, we have those moments when we recognize God's hand in our lives.

PRO-LIFE NEWS

Several members of Holy Cross Parish attended the Regina Pro-Life Annual Dinner last week. The guest speaker was Jonathon Van Maren, a public speaker, writer and director at the Canadian Centre for Bio-Ethical Reform (CCBR), a national pro-life organization. His topic was "How we got here". He explained how our world is utterly different from the one that existed just a few decades ago. But, how did it happen? Why did everything change?

One of the factors of change was the "sexual revolution" that changed the sexual morality and behavior of people affecting marriages and families. Today, children as young as nine years old, are now being shaped by pornography...here in Canada! Governments now advocate for "sexual and reproductive health", a euphemism that includes contraception, sterilization and abortion.

A very interesting and informative presentation! [Additional comment by another attendee's take on the presentation: All this under the guise of female empowerment and freedom. We have lost our moral compass and ignore the fact that with freedom comes responsibility and, instead, have become a throwaway culture: from babies to the elderly, from the mentally ill to the poor. We have lost the intimacy that life gives, be it marital relations, carrying a child in the womb, or caring for a loved one.]



Updates to Hospital Chaplains

As of April 8, 2025, the Saskatchewan Health Authority is now asking patients at Admission if they would like a Spiritual Care Visit during their hospital stay in the General or Pasqua Hospital. They will collect the patient's faith information and notify the chaplains that you are in the hospital. This information is not stored at the hospital upon discharge, so you will need to provide the information for additional hospitalizations.

If you end up in the hospital by the emergency room, you are not going to be asked this question. If you would like to have a visit, you or a family member can use the contact information below to speak with a hospital chaplain. If you would like a visit from your parish priest, you will need to notify the chaplain or the parish to let them know that you are in the hospital.

In the Fraternal Program Awards group 51 to 80 members of Regina Councils received all 6 awards. Our Msgr. Gerein Council received 2 of the awards for Family and Special Olympics. This is a true testament to the dedication and hard work of our Council members.

As a result of donations to the K of C Vocations Endowment fund, the K of C Charitable Foundation will give each of the seven Seminarians from the Dioceses and Eparchy within Saskatchewan \$9,100 towards the cost of their development and education.

For the year 2024, our Council's Vocation Endowment donation target was \$1,350. Thanks to the support of Holy Cross Parishioners, friends and brother Knights a total of \$3,135.00 (232% of the target) was donated. A big THANK YOU to all who supported the Vocations Endowment.

SACRED HEART OF JESUS ICON PRAYER PROGRAM

This is an invitation to all Knights, their families and Holy Cross parishioners to attend a special icon service dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The prayer liturgy with communion is being sponsored by Msgr. Gerein Council and will be held on Tuesday, May 6th at 7:00 PM in Holy Cross.
